There is some molecular anthropological evidence for intermarriage amongst Siberian population groups. Linguistic investigations have found evidence for language contact through loanwords and structural borrowings. Could social anthropology identify past contacts between populations? The analysis of data among Even (clan names, geographical positions, demography, economies, languages, rules of marriage, kinship terminologies of regional groups) informs us about the contacts between regional groups and neighbouring peoples, conditions of economic life and cultural shifts. New developments should follow.

I collected a significant amount of data on every aspect of these societies: social organization, the economy, technical knowledge, symbolic representations of wild and domestic animals, plants, space, identities and pan-identity, the social and ritual uses of languages and dialects, linguistic innovations, and so on.
